Mid Island Aggregates – applied for an extension of mine Two water studies (quarterly) 1) water 2) sediment Started at Elkington Forest, 8 sites checked exceedances gradually came up after heavy rain fall top ones were the last two tests #7 Sooke Lake Rd and Shawnigan Bridge no too bad (see attached forwarded by Cliff Evans for specific locations) worst reading was at the West Shawnigan Lake Rd bridge studies are on-line (forwarded electronically with minutes of AGM) SIA site – reading is quite high But once checked further down (after lot 21) the figures are higher Therefore, materials coming from lot 21 Van Horn Creek – reading very high Studies were done by a private company Manganese exceedance (ie couldn't support fish) was past ephemeral stream at lot 23 Other report was on quality Lots in the yellow/aquatic creatures cannot live 6.2. President's Report: Bruce Biggest issue in attempting to do ecological practices is because lands are held privately Most extensive private land ownership are the timber companies Both participated early in helping our cause Ekistics and Couverdon - \$50K investment to our early work Island Timberlands – new staff and forthcoming in discussions Both have largest impact on upland forest We have been approaching them for some time Meeting took place on Feb. 24 In the long-run their social licence would become more difficult Climate change increased with growth of population, etc, can be predicted See 50-year plan Shawnigan was faced with two 50-year plan (other was SIA/necessary planning for the forest company and their crop holdings) Timber companies would be monitoring over the course of time Determining information and monitoring for their next rotation, which is a 50-year source of information Out of necessity, these companies are planning for at least one rotation ahead This is about 5 X any OCP Electoral cycle is 4 years Vision of political leadership is even shorter than OCP Most humans are lucky for a year projection or even a few weeks What would it be like if we were to adopt the necessary 50-year plan as a standard? Why not attach our EBCP with their 50-year plan? If the SBS starts the round table again, we can talk about what we're doing in collaboration with Island Timberlands and TimberWest for our 50 plan regarding holdings in the watershed

Then we'll challenge every other participant in that round table to meet that 50-year challenge with the request to project all land use managers/owners to do the same Ie lake front owners and aging septics and those drawing commercial water Start thinking in a 50-year time span as a whole, think intergenerational A very interesting challenge to take to the public driven by the timber companies long term planning and quite different from the traditional practices If we agree to go forward, if the SBS agrees and supports, the timber companies will begin implementing this model (50-year planning is only one rotation) **The timber companies have agreed to host/present at the first meeting (Spring) Motion to reinvigorate the round table with the idea to seek a 50-year plan with Island Timberlands, TimberWest, and the Basin Society– carried and moved**
